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the county in which the action is pending, and whenever possible within the District's boundaries,

and in such other counties or by any other means that the Court may direct.

- 14. The District proposes to provide notice of this validation action by publication of the Summons in the *Fresno Business Journal*, which is a newspaper published in general circulation in the County of Fresno. In addition to the information required by the Code of Civil Procedure 861.1, the Summons will include a link to the District's internet website where any interested person may obtain a copy of the validation complaint and exhibits.
- 15. The District is informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that the proceedings held herein and the adoption of the Resolution are of general knowledge to the persons affected thereby or interested therein. The District proposes two other reasonably practicable manners of providing notice: 1) by mail to all District landowners; and 2) by posting a link to this validation complaint, Conversion Contract, and the Resolution prominently on the District's internet website. The District requests the Court order accordingly.

Factual Background

- 16. The United States, through Reclamation, constructed and operates the Central Valley Project ("CVP" or "Project") for diversion, storage, carriage, distribution, for beneficial use, flood control, irrigation, municipal, domestic, industrial, fish and wildlife mitigation, protection and restoration, power generation and distribution, salinity control, navigation and other beneficial uses, of the waters of the Sacramento River, the American River, the Trinity River, and the San Joaquin River, and their tributaries.
- 17. On or about December 23, 1963, the District and Reclamation entered into Contract No. 14-06-200-701-A (the "1963 Contract") for delivery of Project water through the Delta-Mendota Canal, a component of the CVP facilities. The 1963 Contract included the delivery of permanent "Schedule 2" water ("Rights Water"), and for delivery of supplemental water purchased from the United States ("Contract Water"), both for irrigation purposes. The 1963 Contract was for a term of forty (40) years.
 - 18. The District and Reclamation subsequently entered into interim renewal

1	Resolution, and each of the findings, determinations, and terms therein;	
2	(b) Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 864, the District's	
3	adoption of and authorizations in the Resolution are "in existence" for the purpose of determining	
4	their validity in this action;	
5	(c) The Conversion Contract and Resolution are proper matters to be	
6	validated in this in rem validation action brought pursuant to the Validation Statutes;	
7	(d) The District's actions related to the Resolution and Conversion	
8	Contract were valid and proper under California law, and so validate the Conversion Contract and	
9	all of the District's actions related thereto;	
10	(e) This action be binding and conclusive as to all matters adjudicated	
11	herein and as to all matters which could have been adjudicated herein, against the District and	
12	against all other parties to this action;	
13	(f) All persons shall be permanently enjoined and restrained from	
14	instituting any action or proceeding challenging, <i>inter alia</i> , the validity of the Resolution and the
